Growth begins with self-awareness.


We commit to learning, unlearning, and listening — especially when feedback is uncomfortable. We expect curiosity over defensiveness and accountability over intent.

WELCOME TO WINTHROP



Winthrop WA History

1886

The Moses Indian Reservation was abolished and the valley was opened to homesteading. Trappers and prospectors camped where the town baseball diamond is now. James Sullivan and his wife build the first cabin.

1892

Guy Waring became the post master. His wife, and three step children had moved here a year earlier.

1924

Winthrop was incorporated as a proper town. The Upper Methow Valley Power and Light Company built a power plant on the Methow River.

1970

Western renovation of Winthrop business district modeled after the theme town of Leavenworth. A year later the North Cascades Highway opened.

HISTORY OF THE TOWN OF WINTHROP

Winthrop, Washington's history begins with Native American tribes who lived along the Methow, Twisp, and Chewuch Rivers, sustaining themselves through fishing, hunting, and gathering. Trappers arrived in the 1800s, and by 1883 the gold rush brought the first permanent white settlers.

Guy Waring, considered the town's founder, settled at the river forks in 1891 and named Winthrop after author Theodore Winthrop. After a devastating fire in 1893, the town rebuilt – including Waring's Duck Brand Saloon, which still stands today as Town Hall. His Methow Trading Company operated for nearly 50 years, and his Harvard roommate, Owen Wister, later wrote *The Virginian* after visiting the area.

Winthrop declined after World War II but was revitalized in 1972 with a community-led Western restoration as Highway 20 opened through the North Cascades. Designed to preserve the valley's spirit, the Old West theme still defines the town today.

Surrounded by national forest and wilderness, Winthrop now blends rich history, outdoor adventure, and small-town charm – celebrated each year during the annual 49er Days festival.

HISTORY OF WINTHROP RINK



An old-timey photograph hangs in the main hallway of the Winthrop Rink. Taken in the 1920s, it shows a couple skating on a frozen lake in the Methow Valley.

Their names are lost to history, but I think of them as Buford and Mildred. Maybe that morning they'd been sitting in rocking chairs, Buford quilting and Mildred whittling. Then Mildred set down her knife and said, "Buford, I've got cabin fever. Let's hitch the horses and go ice skating." It could've happened. Who knows? The point is, outdoor ice skating has long been part of life in the Methow Valley.

In 2024, the Winthrop Rink celebrates 25 years as a nonprofit. The dream of a permanent outdoor rink began in 1999, when volunteers flooded the Red Barn Community Center parking lot to create a temporary rink. They formed a nonprofit to build an outdoor rink for local and visiting skaters – and to support the tourism economy. The Winthrop Rink is their Field of Dreams.

STATEMENT ON USA HOCKEY PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY POLICY

Seattle Pride Hockey Association unequivocally condemns USA Hockey's recent policy change that restricts participation based on sex assigned at birth. This policy is harmful, exclusionary, and fundamentally at odds with the values of equity, dignity, and belonging that hockey—and sport more broadly—should represent.

Transgender and nonbinary athletes belong in hockey. Full stop.

We want to be absolutely clear with our community: there is no change to the Seattle Pride Classic, our mission, or who is welcome to play. The Seattle Pride Classic remains fully inclusive of transgender, nonbinary, and gender-diverse players, just as it always has been. Our commitment to LGBTQIA+ inclusion is unwavering.

Like almost every hockey association across the country, players in the Seattle Pride Classic are required to register with USA Hockey for insurance purposes only. This administrative requirement does not reflect our values, nor does it change how we define eligibility, inclusion, or belonging within our tournament. We recognize that this requirement may feel painful, frustrating, or contradictory in light of USA Hockey's stance—and those feelings are valid.

Let us be clear: we do not agree with this policy, we do not support it, and we are actively opposed to it. We are exploring every possible alternative to reduce reliance on systems that exclude members of our community, while ensuring player safety and event viability.

Seattle Pride Classic exists because LGBTQIA+ players—especially trans and nonbinary players—have been pushed out of traditional hockey spaces for far too long. Our tournament is, and will remain, a place where you do not have to justify your identity to participate, where your gender is respected, and where hockey is played in the spirit of joy, safety, and chosen family.

To our trans community members: you are wanted here, you are protected here, and you are essential to this tournament. We stand with you, we believe you, and we will continue fighting for a hockey world that does better than this.

Hockey is for everyone—and we mean everyone.

TOURNAMENT RULES

Frozen Pride Classic 2026 Tournament Guidelines

1. By playing in FPC26, all players hereby agree to adhere to both SPHA's Participant Conduct Policy and Inclusion in Hockey Statement, as well as USA Hockey's Zero Tolerance Policy.
2. At time of tournament, all players must be at least 18 years of age and be fully paid prior to any games.
3. All players must be fully registered with the tournament, with their respective team via their mySPHA Account, along with a current 2025-26 USA Hockey membership, and players acknowledge that there is an inherent risk of injury while playing ice hockey.
4. All 2025-29 USA Hockey Official Rules of Ice Hockey apply. See Supplemental Rules below for variations.
5. All teams are guaranteed a minimum and maximum of four (4) round-robin games. There will be no standings or championships in this tournament, although score will be kept.
6. SPHA will staff each game with two (2) USA Hockey-certified referees and one (1) scorekeeper.
7. Team Captain's must furnish SPHA with their team rosters along with individual jersey numbers ahead of the tournament weekend. Rosters are not needed for each individual game.
8. Teams must furnish their own sets of jersey & socks: a primary (home) and secondary (away) color.
9. SPHA reserves the right to adjust schedules and teams if there is a clear lack of parity.
10. Fighting is NOT welcomed and WILL NOT be tolerated. Any player(s) assessed any penalty under Rule 615 (Fighting) will result in immediate ejection from the tournament.

TOURNAMENT RULES, CONT.

FPC26 Game Format:

1. There will be no standings, and no points issued to winning teams.
2. Games may end in a tie with no tie breaker.

PRIMARY GAME LENGTHS

It is imperative that we collectively work together to ensure all scheduled ice times remain on-time and on-schedule to maximize our use of these 60-minute ice slots. Scorekeepers may start the warm-up clock earlier than the scheduled game time if the ice cut is completed early. To that end, always be ready and waiting to take the ice for your game a few minutes early.

ROUND-ROBIN

1. 4-minute warm up.
2. Two (2) 13-minute, run-time periods, plus a 13-minute, stop-time, third period.
3. The final 30-seconds of period one and two will be stop-time.
4. 60-second intermission between periods.
5. No time outs given.

BE READY EARLY! To stay on schedule, the warm-up clock may begin once the ice doors are closed.

PENALTY TIMES

Minor: 2:00 minutes (Third Period: 2:00 minutes)

Major: 5:00 minutes (Third Period: 5:00 minutes)

FPC26 Time Regulations:

1. In the interest of staying on schedule, all players are encouraged to be ready 5+ minutes prior to their scheduled game time. The warm-up clock may begin once the ice doors are closed or at the scheduled game time, whichever is sooner (this means a warm-up may begin on-time even if the ice doors are still open to prevent delays, ultimately reducing warm ups).
2. There are no time-outs in round-robin play.
3. Game Lengths: See below table for Primary Game Lengths.
4. All penalty(ies) will be 2:00 minutes in length.
5. Total game times do not exceed 60-minutes total.

TOURNAMENT RULES, CONT.

FPC 26 Supplemental Rules

1. Any player who receives any combination of three (3) Penalties in one (1) game will be immediately ejected from that game. However, this will not result in a Game Misconduct or ejection/expulsion from the remainder of the tournament.
2. No checking. FPC26 is to be played under the competitive contact category.
3. Team Captains may not perform any roster changes without consulting SPHA in advance.
4. Any player currently suspended by any USA Hockey sanctioned adult hockey league, or any other adult hockey league within the State of Washington, is not eligible to play in the tournament. Any suspensions levied in the tournament may carry over to any player's regular adult league team sanctioned by USA Hockey.
5. If you are currently suspended by USA Hockey and/or any of its leagues and/or associations, and/or any other league within the State of Washington, please contact SPHA and your Team Captain to determine eligibility to play.
6. We respectfully ask for your cooperation and transparency. If you fail to notify SPHA and continue to participate in the tournament, you may be permanently removed from future SPHA programs.

FOR ALL DIVISIONS:

1. **'Gretzky Rule'** applies in the tournament. Gretzky Rule states that no player may score more than three (3) goals in a single game. If a player scores a fourth (4th) goal, it will be disallowed, and the play will resume in the offending team's defensive zone (like icing). No penalty will be assessed.
2. **'Blue Line Icing'** applies in the tournament. This means that there will be no icing unless the puck is shot from inside a team's defending zone, and it crosses the opposing team's far-red line.
3. SPHA's Conduct & Ethics Committee reserves the right to review all cases involving Major Penalties, Game Misconducts, and Match Penalties.

TOURNAMENT RULES, CONT.

FPC 26 Supplemental Rules Cont.

Please understand that it is a collective effort to maintain ice times and to prevent delays and overruns. While there are unavoidable delays (i.e., major injuries, repairs to boards or ice), here are some helpful tips to prevent unnecessary delays:

1. Start clearing the ice of warm up pucks approximately 30 seconds prior to the end of warmups.
2. After warmups, promptly line up for the face-off drop.
3. During stoppages of play or after a goal, quickly prepare for the proceeding face-off drop.
4. At the end of the game, perform a handshake line and depart the ice.

Refunds

There are no account credits or refunds for players and/or teams impacted by delays and/or lost ice times from events outside of SPHA's control. Please refer to the Cancellations & Refunds Policy for more information.
